## The Mug House – Claines

Bishop Wulstan built churches in all his manors and the church at Claines was originally called the church of Northwick. The date of the church at Claines is uncertain, but it must have been built between 1075 and 1095. The re-building of the Norman church was done mainly in the 15<sup>th</sup> century, though a portion of the chancel could be earlier. In the churchyard of Claines Parish Church stands the Mug House. It is the only known pub to stand in consecrated ground, and has a history dating back at least 600 years. The Mug House was used as a coaching inn to cater for the local aristocracy who had some distance to travel to church. A coin dated 1562 was discovered during restoration work, during which a section of the original Wattle and Daub walls was found and preserved for history under glass by the front door. The very name 'mug' was said to be connected with the old time communion plate. The name was also associated with the practice of clinching a deal over a 'mug' of ale.
